Benjamin J. Heineman, Jr., was senior vice president law and public affairs for General Electric for 18 years until retirement in '05. He was responsible for a staff of 1100 lawyers in 100 countries. G.E.'s law portfolio broadly covered more than legal issues, being deeply engaged in such business and management issues as globalization, corporate citizenship, anti-corruption and dispute resolution. Before joining GE, Heineman was managing partner (Sidley & Austin) active in Supreme Court work; prior to that, Assistant Secretary for Planning & Evaluation with the U.S. Department of Health, Education & Welfare (under President Carter). He began his career as a staff attorney for the Center for Law & Social Policy and clerked for the Hon. Potter Stewart. A graduate of Harvard (Phi Beta Kappa; Rhodes scholar and editorial chairman, Harvard Crimson) and Yale Law (editor of the Law Review). Heineman is a senior Fellow at Harvard's John F. Kennedy School of Government and a distinguished senior Fellow at Harvard's Law School. He also serves as a Senior Advisor to the Center for Strategic and International Studies, where he is a board member. This year the "National Law Journal" named him among the "100 most influential lawyers in America."
